Dr. Jeremy England | August 22

Dr. Jeremy England will give a Dvar Torah following Shacharit on "Creation, Language, and the Tree of Life." He will also teach at Seudah Shlishit on "Yosef the Dreamer: Science, Choice, and Miracle."

Jeremy England is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Physics at MIT. He is a theorist, and conducts research in a collection of topics that aim to trace the boundary between inanimate and living matter. Jeremy has a longstanding interest in exploring the Torah's subtle commentaries on scientific reasoning, and has written and spoken at college campuses on these topics many times in the past. He lives with his wife, Eleina, and toddler-age son, Elhanan, in Cambridge, MA.
